INTRODUCTION


One of the mandating requirements under the urban development Grant is that Projects that have been identified for funding have to be assessed in different phases of Project preparation using Environmental and social impact assessment checklists.

JUSTIFICATION

This is according to stage two of the social assessment process which requires screening at Projectdesignsstage.

The objective is to determine whether the Project complies with KUSP eligible Projects. The social and Environmental safeguards officers conducted the assessment in order to identify any potential social impacts and type of assessment required.

It should also determine if the Project would cause negative impacts on marginalized or vulnerable groups living along the Project corridor. The Project in Nyamira Municipality is the Upgrading to Bitumen Standards of 1.5km from Hospital to Public works


The team screening the proposed Project site

On whether the Project would cause diverse social and Environmental effects, the team noted that this is minimal risk Project. There are about 18 kiosks that are on the road reserve, discussions with the owners' demonstrated willingness to relocate since they were constructed on the road reserve.

Other issues include: Waterpipes, and electricity poles that will need to be relocated at some point near Bisamm Academy. There are major water pipes that transport water from the water treatment Projects at Nyamira.

There is no need for Development of an Abbreviated Resettlement Plan (ARAP) since the Project does not require physical displacement of any households.
